

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE FACULTY

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

The very first experience for the newly admitted students of the MSW Course is the intensive orientation to the social realities and the nature and mode of studies followed at the Faculty which lasts for a week.

DISSERTATION

Under the guidance of a Faculty Member, the students prepare a research proposal, methodology and tools for data collection; analyses the data & prepares the dissertation report. The Research Work is spread over one and half years through which the students learn research skills & methodology.

FIELDWORK REPORTING & SUPERVISORY CONFERENCE

Students are required to prepare a handwritten report of each field work day, and submit it to their respective field work supervisors. Every week, each student has one to one interaction with his/her supervisor during which the activities done by the students at field work are discussed and supervisor's guidance is availed.

EVALUATION CONFERENCE

Twice in a Semester, an extensive and exhaustive report about their Field Work is prepared by the students based on a set criteria which seeks to evaluate the students' growth and learning. An Evaluation Conference is held between the Fieldwork Supervisor and the student, after which the student is given the deserved grade.

VIVA-VOCE

A Panel composed of the Faculty Members conducts a viva-voce of every student at the end of each semester to discuss and debate the overall growth of the student. It is also a way of preparing to learn to recognize areas of improvement, and art of giving interviews and presenting ones work at best.

AGENCY DAY

On this day the agency personnel whom the students report to on the field work; participate in an interactive session with the Faculty members. Performance of students & ongoing issues of the field area are discussed; hence facilitating the student's evaluation process.

STUDENT SEMINAR

In the final term, the senior students go through an experience of preparing and presenting a well thought-out paper for critical examination from peers and teachers. Experts from various fields are invited to preside over the Sessions. The students' approach an external expert for guidance and work on a common theme.

RURAL CAMP

To groom students for overall competence, they are catered with an exposure of rural setting, over and above classroom lectures. Rural Camp is an enriching experience through which students get grass root exposure to community life from social work perspective. The Rural Camp for the Batch of 2016 was based on the theme "Jagrut Nagarik , Samruddh Samaj, Majboot Lokshahi, Ej Sacho Vikas", in Kamiyala Village (Ahmedabad District). The theme focused on the socio-political issues and spreading awareness regarding the same through street plays, rallies, posters etc.

STUDY TOUR

The Study Tour constitutes as an indispensable part of the curriculum that practically broadens student's perspectives and provides an insight about the realities of the society. It is meant to lend exposure of different settings, mainly industrial developmental, correctional and medical. The Study Tour for the Batch of 2016 facilitates learning about the upcoming challenges in the field of IR, HR, CSR, Correctional Social Work and Social Development in the states of Himachal Pradesh, Punjab and UT of Chandigarh.
